# President's Letter - Book Sale Advisory Committee Needed

I want to update you on the latest news from the book sale front. We had some discussion at our September general meeting, including a suggestion from Pat Poskocil that we consider joining with another community organization with similar scholarship goals in order to increase the number of people available to work on the sale.

Our Board, the Literature group and Mystery Buffs have also discussed the book sale's future, and a number of members said they would like to see it continue in some form, rather than disappearing completely. All agree that modifications need to be made if we continue. No one has said to me that they believe the book sale should continue exactly as it has been.

At the board's direction, I would like **an advisory committee**, chaired by Karla Bullett, to review options/modifications to make the sale more manageable. **We need two to four more members** with book sale experience to join this committee and propose several plans to be presented to the whole membership. Joining this advisory group is not committing yourself to a book sale leadership position.

I expected that we would discuss and come to consensus at the October meeting. However, the board feels that more time is needed, so we will postpone this discussion until the November meeting instead. The advisory committee will present their options and we will discuss and decide at the November meeting.

**Please consider becoming a member of this advisory committee.** This is an important decision for our branch. We are extremely grateful to Tom Mosillo and Anita Dickson for allowing us this flexibility and we want to use it wisely.
