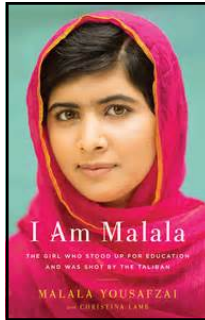

The Equal Rights Amendment in Illinois



After two straight days of persistent advocacy from AAUW and other advocates in May, the Illinois Senate passed a resolution to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) to the U.S. Constitution!

We gained a great deal of momentum and the issue will come up again in the veto session now that it has passed the Senate. Please keep reminding people of the ERA's importance, and make sure your legislators know it is important to you in this election year. Opponents are spreading a lot of disinformation--as they did decades ago--so we need to keep the facts and realities coming. Continue urging Congress to remove the deadline for ratification.

The lack of constitutional equality for women reaches every aspect of women's lives. The ERA would clarify, once and for all, that sex discrimination in employment, health insurance, Social Security, education, and more is a violation of our constitutional rights as Americans. The ERA was introduced in 1923 and sent to the states for ratification in 1972. Unfortunately, the ERA fell three states short of the 38 states that needed to ratify it to go into effect. Illinois is one of the states that did not ratify the amendment in 1972, but now we have a chance to fix that.
