On October 24, AAUW released a new report, **Graduating** to a Pay Gap.

"Graduating to a Pay Gap" is an update of sorts to the 2007 AAUW report "Behind the Pay Gap," which found that just one year after college graduation, women are paid only 80 percent of what their male counterparts are paid. The new report will offer concrete steps on how to address this persistent problem, talk about its impact on women with college loans, and reveal the latest salary data for this population.
