Our first program this year will feature LAF plaintiff Daniele Hoffman. Daniele will talk to us about her experience in the Indiana National Guard which led to her sexual assault complaint and our support of her suit. Our meet & greet begins at 7pm, upstairs at the First Church.

Elmhurst and Downers Grove Branches are co-sponsoring with us, and members from Hinsdale and Wheaton-Glen Ellyn will attend.

As you know, the issue of sexual assault in the military is finally being addressed by Congress. We all need to be well-informed and prepared to act by doing what is needed to make sure that this problem, which affects both women and men, is dealt with sooner rather than later.

Much as many of us will miss the potluck, this is such a timely issue that the board felt we must forgo the potluck in order to give us all a chance to hear Daniele's moving story. Those who heard her at the state convention were extremely moved by her presentation.

Successful 2013 Used Book Sale

Thanks to everyone for contributing to make the 2013 Used Book Sale such a success. Sales for the four days totaled \$10,992. Taking expenses, including a \$500 donation to Dare to Dream away, there is a profit of \$9250 to use for AAUW Funds and Local Scholarships. This amount is \$1165 more than last year.

Once again, various teams took responsibility for volunteer recruitment, volunteer reminders, home pick up, barrel collecting, set up, drop off dates, sorting, sale, collectibles, publicity, and move out. We couldn't have had such a rewarding sale without them. As usual so many members contributed their time to help with all aspects of the sale. Thank you to everyone.

New and past barrel sites were used, as well as four drop off dates, to generate donations for the sale. At least 500 boxes were moved in on the first drop off night, the most ever. We had many excellent books available for buyers to choose, approximately 15, 000 titles.

Publicity for the sale was outstanding; covering print, electronic media, and street signage. Bookmarks given out at the Lombard May craft fair were an additional advertising avenue. It obviously brought in many customers.

We had many compliments on the organization of sorted books. Alphabetizing a number of categories proved especially helpful. We had seventeen teen volunteers who worked during sorting and sale days. This saved at least \$200 in expenses. One of the volunteers from Willowbrook High School donated 28 hours of his time.

The sale days went smoothly with excellent results each day. The collectibles sales each day were at least \$25 more than last year.


